Here are the facts: Measure A authorizes a blank check using taxpayer dollars for the civic center project. The Council is already talking about a property about a property and the November ballot, charging for fallen trees in 37 roadways and other new taxes on residents. What's next?

We agree -- improved facilities are warranted. But the \$14M -- and likely 57 much more once bids are received, the building is furnished and upkeep 69 is considered -- of so-called "unallocated public funds" targeted to be 79 spent on a new civic center is not spare change. 89

A huge structure with a large foyer, gym, and copper gutters was not 62 controversial if funded by private donations. The dismal failure of that 113 campaign -- which received pledges of less than 30% of the \$25 million (25 promised -- should cause us to reconsider the project, not to bail it out 138 with taxpayer money.

Town studies determined that Atherton needs more than \$72M for 151 drainage deficiencies, school and pedestrian route safety improvements, 157 pension and healthcare debt obligations. These basics can't be funded if 170 "unallocated" tax dollars are diverted to a grandiose complex. 137

Not long ago, Atherton was facing possible insolvency, with skyrocketing (89 retiree and staff obligations. A radical restructuring together with (98 fortuitous increased property tax revenues ultimately provided a stable 207 financial footing. But fate – and real estate markets -- can be fickle. 2(8

The project should be cut back. We should be shown alternative designs 230 WITH their costs -- construction, furnishing and annual operating budgets 239 -- before authorizing the use of our tax dollars. 247
