City of Brisbane TOT Argument Against Measure



START HERE:

Guests traveling to our city fork over a sizable transient occupancy tax (TOT) of 14%, every day that they patronize the hotels, motels, and inns here.

Now City Council proposes to saddle them with <u>another \$2.50 tax per room/night</u>, to fund <u>general municipal expenses</u>.

City Council wants people who do <u>not</u> live in Brisbane, thus largely do <u>not</u> take advantage of city services, to fund the services used by businesses and homeowners who <u>do</u> live or work here.

Basically, our public servants want a free ride, to stick out-of-towners with the bill, and compel esteemed local businesses to serve as tax collector.

Would you do that to your friends or co-workers? No! That would be immoral, as a form of theft.

If your family uses city services every week, shouldn't your family be responsible to pay for them?

When you dine out, do you expect the next table to foot your bill? Those who regularly do so are called swindlers. Or petty thieves.

Just because the city can tap visitors to pay for municipal services they will not or cannot use, does not make it right. If a majority approves? Still not right.

Maybe you find our "theft" analogy a bit strong.

Perhaps you agree, though, with our sense of fair play.

With travel/hospitality industries barely treading water during the pandemic, and with inflation further constraining their prospects' budgets, they're a vulnerable target to expect to fund city services.

Instead, City Council should look inward, and identify opportunities for <u>dramatic cuts</u>, to all but core services.

Instead of hiking this tax, let's help hotels compete, entice visitors to travel, dine, and shop here more often, not less, and boost the local economy.
