## Argument in Favor of Measure U

This Measure would:

- Save taxpayer dollars.
- Enhance democracy by increasing the voice of voters in electing County Supervisors.

When a member of the San Mateo County Board of Supervisors vacates his or her office early, it is in the best interests of the community to fill the seat in such a way that will save taxpayer dollars while giving voters a greater voice in who represents them. This measure would make three key changes to the San Mateo County Charter:

- By mandating an election for any vacancy in the first two years and nine months of a Supervisor's term, voters would now elect a replacement Supervisor rather than have the position potentially filled through appointment. Holding an election to fill a vacancy would encourage debate on County issues and allow voters to choose their Supervisor.
- When a special election to fill a seat on the Board of Supervisors is called, an election could be completed through all-mail balloting which is not the case today. An all-mail election would save the County money while ensuring a democratic election process.
- Any County elected official could vacate his or her seat through an irrevocable letter of resignation effective on a future date. This would permit an election to move forward while a Supervisor remains in office to represent his or her constituents until a replacement is seated.

The San Mateo County Board of Supervisors and the San Mateo County Charter Review Committee recommend these changes.

We encourage you to vote **YES on this Measure** to protect taxpayer dollars and enhance the voice of the voter.
