Argument in Favor of Measure S

Protect San Bruno's public finances WITHOUT raising taxes on residents and property owners. Vote yes on Measure S.

California voters approved Proposition 64 in 2016. This legalized the sale and use of cannabis in California. A number of our neighboring cities (including Brisbane, Pacifica, South San Francisco, and San Carlos) have already passed similar taxes on cannabis businesses.

Although San Bruno does not currently allow cannabis-based business in our community a "YES" on Measure S would provide the City of San Bruno with a much needed revenue stream should cannabis be allowed in the future.

Voting yes on Measure S does not remove the prohibition on cannabis businesses.

Voting yes on Measure S does not tax medical patients using cannabis or cannabis users.

Voting yes on Measure S would provide a new revenue stream into San Bruno's general fund budget for capital projects, public safety, city parks, traffic improvement, and street maintenance programs.

By law, ALL of Measure S revenue will stay here in San Bruno. Not one penny would go to Sacramento.
