Supplement to the San Mateo County Election Administration Plan for the November 8, 2022 Statewide General Election

The November 8, 2022 Statewide General Election will be the largest election held in San Mateo County.

Vote Center Locations

In Burlingame, a new Community Center has opened, and it will replace the Burlingame City Hall as an 11-Day Vote Center. Burlingame City Hall will replace the McKinley Elementary School as a 4-Day Vote Center.

We will have a Vote Center at the American Legion Post 105 in Redwood City. The facility is on a main street for buses and close to a train stop. It offers more space and more parking than the North Fair Oaks Library used in the June election.

A third Vote Center has been added in San Carlos. In addition to the 11-Day Vote Center at the Library, the two 4-Day Vote Centers will be in the Community United Church of Christ and Episcopal Church of the Epiphany. This will be the first time we have a Vote Center in this Episcopal church.

Instead of three Vote Centers, there will be two Vote Centers in San Bruno. We will be in the Courtyard Marriott again but in place of two school locations, there will be a 4-Day Vote Center at Bethany Presbyterian Church.

Drop Box Locations

There are two new Drop Box locations – one is in front of the new Community Center in Burlingame, and the other, in front of the County Government Parking Structure in Redwood City.

Voter Education and Outreach Plan Additions

The Registration & Elections Division contacted elementary schools throughout the county to ask if they would like to receive "Future Voter" stickers for the students to encourage youngsters to be interested in voting when they are older. We provided 17,030 stickers for students at more than 100 schools to proudly wear.

Two of our partners, the League of Women Voters and SF Peninsula People Power, will help students hold voter registration drives at high schools. They are aiming to have registration drives on September 20, National Voter Registration Day, and throughout the last two weeks of September, designated as High School Voter Education Weeks.

We will continue our efforts from the June Statewide Direct Primary to encourage more registration and voting among those eligible in the housing unstable population, parolees and inmates at the County Correctional Facilities.
