88	January 6, 2017	Last day for a local entity to deliver a resolution requesting election services and consolidation from the San Mateo County Board of Supervisors for the April 4, 2017 Election. EC §§1405, 10002, 12001 Ed.C §5322
88	January 6, 2017	10-Calendar-day public review period begins January 6 at 5:00 p.m. and ends January 16 at 5:00 p.m. for all documents filed as of the filing deadline. Between these dates the Elections Official or any registered voter, eligible to vote on the contest in question, may seek a writ of mandate or injunction requiring any or all of the materials to be amended or deleted if found to be misleading or inaccurate. Note: Deadline falls on a holiday. Date is moved to next business day on January 17, 2017 per EC §15

82	January 12, 2017	The Elections Official will designate a measure letter at the Elections Office at 11 a.m. on this date. EC §13116
81	January 13, 2017	Primary arguments in favor of or against local measures are due by 5:00 p.m. Such arguments, if already submitted, may be changed until and including today. EC §§9501-9502, 9600-9601
81	January 13, 2017	10-calendar-day public review period begins January 13, 2017 at 5:00 p.m. and ends January 23, 2017 at 5:00 p.m. for primary arguments filed in favor of and against measures. Between these dates the Elections Official or any registered voter, eligible to vote on the contest in question, may seek a writ of mandate or injunction requiring any or all of the materials to be amended or deleted if found to be misleading or inaccurate.

71	January 23, 2017	Rebuttal Arguments for measures where a primary argument was filed both in favor and against are due by 5:00 p.m. Such arguments may be changed until and including today. Impartial analysis regarding school district ballot measures due. EC §§9501-04, 9600-9601
71	January 23, 2017	10-calendar-day public review period begins January 23, 2017 at 5:00 p.m. and ends February 2, 2017 at 5:00 p.m. for rebuttal arguments filed in favor and/or against measures and impartial analyses. Between these dates the Elections Official or any registered voter, eligible to vote on the contest in question, may seek a writ of mandate or injunction requiring any or all of the materials to be amended or deleted if found to be misleading or inaccurate.

60 7	February 3, 2017 March 28, 2017	Between these dates, any registered military or overseas voter may apply for a vote by mail ballot. EC §§ 300(b), 3001, 3103, 3302, 3304
45	February 18, 2017	County Elections Official must send ballots and balloting material to all military and overseas voters who filed ballot applications by this date. EC §3105, 3114
40	February 23, 2017	1st Pre-election campaign and supplemental independent expenditure statements due. GC §§84200.5(c), 84200.8(a), 84203.5
29	March 6, 2017	Between these dates, Vote by Mail ballots & Voter Information Pamphlet will be sent to all registered voters. To ensure that the voter has enough time to return their ballot, the last day to request a replacement Vote by Mail ballot through the mail is March 28, 2017. Requests made after March 28, 2017 must be made in person at the Voting Center at 40 Tower Road, San Mateo.

15	March 20, 2017	Voter registration closes on this date for the April 4, 2017 Special All Mail Ballot Election. Voters must register by this date to be eligible to vote in this election. Voter registration forms postmarked prior to or with this date are accepted. EC §§2102, 2107
12	March 23, 2017	Second pre-election campaign and supplemental independent expenditure statements due. GC §§84200.5(c), 84200.8(b), 84203.5
7	March 28, 2017	Last day to request a replacement Vote by Mail ballot through the mail. Requests made after March 28, 2017 must be made in person at the Voting Center at 40 Tower Road, San Mateo EC §§3001, 3023, 13303
0	April 4, 2017	Election Day. Voting Center opens at 7 a.m. and closes at 8 p.m. Semifinal official canvass commences upon the closing of the polls, 8:00 p.m. At 8:05 p.m., San Mateo County issues first report and continues to issue reports until all precincts have reported. EC §§1000, 1001, 1100, 1200, 14212, 15150, 15151
+3	April 7, 2017	Vote by Mail ballots postmarked on or before Election Day and received by the County Elections Official by this date shall be counted. EC §§3020, 3117, 4103
+30	May 4, 2017	Last day for County Elections Official to certify election results to the jurisdictions participating in the election. EC §15372
